- Part of Teamsters Union 665




# Waste Zero

- Find the best and highest use of all resources collected
- Healdsburg Landfill Diversion
  - 37% 2018
  - 49% 2023



# Commercial Compost

- 232 commercial compost programs in place in Healdsburg
- All schools and nearly all restaurants have compost service
- CA Mandatory Compost (SB 1383)  
– **99% compliance as of 2023**

# Residential Compost

- 2023 Healdsburg Residential SB 1383 Route Audits (70 Homes)
  - 76% participation in compost program
  - 9% contamination of compost



# NEW Material Recovery Facility (MRF)

- \$35 million project
- Opened Nov. 2023
- Process 400 tons/day
- 7 optical sorters
- Recovery rate 85% - one of the highest in the U.S.

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# Grove Street Underground Utility District




# Background

- The City of Healdsburg received grant funding to complete the Grove Street improvements between Grant Street and Dry Creek Road.
- Ahead of the planned surface improvements, staff is recommending undergrounding the remain overhead utility lines along Grove Street.
- Undergrounding work requires the coordination of affected utilities including PG&E, AT&T, Comcast, Sonic, and the City's Electric Department.
- Formation of an Underground Utility District requires existing overhead utilities and property owners to participate in the undergrounding.

# Proposed District

- District map included with staff report and mailed to property owners
- District includes properties between Dry Creek Road and W. Grant Street
- Existing PG&E electric customers will be converted to City electric service (lower cost, better reliability)
- Construction phase is planned to begin in early 2025



# Grove Street Undergrounding

Estimate construction costs of \$2.0 million.


City will be coordinate design and installation of the joint utility trench.

Staff is recommending the City install service conduits for property owners.



# Typical Service Trench

- Service trench includes conduits for electricity and communication services
- If existing services are underground, little to no work is required



# Next Steps

- If approved, each property owner will be noticed of Council's action and project timelines.
- Staff will continue to coordinate with affected utilities to complete the joint utility trench design and construction drawings.
- Staff will coordinate with property owners on the location and installation of new service conduits.
- Once designs are finalized, staff will request formal bids for the trenching and return to Council for approval.



- Formation of an Underground Utility District requires existing overhead utilities and property owners to participate in the undergrounding.

# Proposed District

- District map included with staff report and mailed to property owners
- District includes properties between Boxheart Drive and Sunnyvale
- Existing PG&E electric customers will be converted to City electric service (lower cost, better reliability)
- Construction phase is planned to begin in early 2026



## Healdsburg Ave Undergrounding

Estimate construction costs of \$4.5 million.


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
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
