# Required Districting Criteria

Traditional redistricting principles used throughout the country and written into state law

There are a number of criteria that are required under the FAIR MAPS Act (ranked):

- Relatively equal size - people, not citizens
- Contiguous – districts should not hop/jump
- Maintain “*communities of interest*”
- Easily identifiable and understandable lines, following natural, and man-made boundaries
- Keep districts compact – appearance/function





- Western district keeps together like communities of interest:
  - Renters
  - Age
  - Income levels
  - Maximizes Latino CVAP



## Recommended Action

- Consider introducing by title only and waive further reading of an Ordinance Amending Healdsburg Municipal Code Article 1 (General Provisions) within Chapter 2.40 (Elections) of Title 2 (Administration and Personnel) to add section 2.40.010.01 “District Elections” to Provide for the Election of Members of the City Council by Five Districts; Establish the District Boundaries; and Election Order of Each District.
