NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the City Council of the City of Healdsburg encourages residents to apply for positions on City Boards, Commissions, and Committees that will have vacancies in 2026.

Pursuant to the Maddy Act, the following is a complete list of the terms expiring in 2026, the names of the incumbents, and the dates of their appointment.

ARTS AND CULTURE COMMISSION

No terms are set to expire in 2026.

The Arts and Culture Commission serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council and staff to help carry out the vision, goals, and strategies outlined in the City’s Arts and Culture Master Plan.

The Arts and Culture Commission consists of seven members, each member to serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and the City Council for three (3) year terms. All members serve without compensation. The Commission meets the 4th Wednesday of the month at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers or such other time and place as the Commission may establish from time to time following proper notice. One of the seven members may be designated by City Council as a youth commissioner under the age of 18. Two of the seven members may reside outside the City limits but must reside at a location that is within the boundaries of the Healdsburg Unified School District.

PARKS & RECREATION COMMISSION

The powers and duties of the Parks and Recreation Commission include serving in an advisory capacity to the City Council and the Community Services Department on policies and programs pertaining to parks, recreation facilities, and programming.

The seven members of the Commission are appointed by a majority of the City Council, each member to serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and the City Council for three (3) year terms and until a successor is appointed. All members serve without compensation. The Commission meets on the second Wednesday of each month at 6:00 PM in the City Hall Council Chamber or such other time and place as the Commission may establish from time to time following proper notice. Two of the seven members may reside outside the City limits but must reside within the boundaries of the Healdsburg Unified School District.

The Planning Commission’s role includes implementation of the City’s Land Use Code (Zoning Ordinance) and Subdivision Ordinance and other regulatory and advisory duties required by the City Council. The Commission also acts as the Historic Committee.

The seven members of the Commission are appointed by a majority of the City Council, each to serve at the will of the City Council for terms of up to four (4) years and until a successor is appointed. The Commission meets the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month at 6:00 PM in the City Hall Council Chamber. Members must reside within the City limits and may be appointed to successive terms without limitations.

SENIOR CITIZEN ADVISORY COMMISSION

The function of the Senior Citizen Advisory Commission is to advise the City Council and the Community Services Department on matters relating to policies and programs which serve senior citizens of the community.

The up to seven members of the Commission are appointed by the City Council. The term of office of all members is three (3) years. The Commission meets the 4th Wednesday of the month, in the City Hall Council Chamber, 401 Grove Street, Healdsburg, CA or at such other time and location as the Commission may establish from time to time following proper notice. Members must reside within the City limits and be senior citizens (55 years of age or older).
